Travel Itinerary

Day 1

Arrival in Kathmandu and check in to the hotel

Day 2

Pilgrimage sightseeing tour to Pashupatinath temple, Boudhanath stupa and Budhanilakanth temple. Then briefing and preparation for yatra

Day 3

Drive from Kathmandu to Syabrubesi. Altitude - 1550 m, 140 km, 8 hours drive

Day 4

Drive from Syabrubesi to Kyrung. You will enter China after immigration and get introduced with your Chinese guide / coach drivers. Altitude - 2700 m, 55 km, 1 hour drive. We will have an acclimatisation walk.

Day 5

Drive from Kyrung to Saga. Altitude - 4640 m, 105 km, 5 hours drive

Travel Itinerary

Day 6

Drive from Saga to Mansarovar and perform puja. Altitude - 4556 m, 410 km, 8 hours drive

Day 7

Drive from Mansarovar to Darchen en-route visit to Chuigumpa hot spring. Altitude - 4664 m, 30 km, 1 hr drive.

#Those who are NOT joining for Kailash parikrama, can stay at Darchen

Day 8

Drive to Tarboch flag pole, first prostration point. Visit Yamdwar and further drive to Sershong (8 km, 15 min drive). Trek to Dirapuk (Altitude - 4765 m, 10 km, 6 hours trek) Overnight stay at guesthouse.

Day 9

Continue Parikrama over Droma La Pass (5585 m) to Zuthulpuk (4700 m, 22 km, 7-8 hours trek). Overnight stay at camp / guesthouse.

Travel Itinerary

Day 10

Last and final day Kailash Parikrama ends near Darchen (Altitude - 4664 m, 14 km, 3-4 hrs trek) and drive to New Dongpa (Altitude - 4464 m, 350 kms, 7 hours drive) or Saga (Altitude - 4640 meter, 430 km, 7/8 hours drive). Packed lunch will be served on the way. Overnight stay at the hotel.

Day 11

Drive from New Dongpa / Saga to Syabrubesi by crossing the Nepal-China border. Altitude - 2700 m, 150 km, 5 hours drive

Day 12

After breakfast, drive from Syabrubesi to Kathmandu. 140 km, 8 hours drive


Day 13

Holy Sites Of Yatra



Pashupatinath Temple

One of the most sacred Hindu temples dedicated to Lord Shiva. It's dedicated to the form of Shiva, "Lord of Animals". It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Boudhanath Stupa

A Buddhist temple and pilgrimage site in Kathmandu. It's one of the world's largest stupas, and is considered a major spiritual landmark



Kailash Parvat

Mt. Kailash, a striking 6,638m (21,778 ft) peak, revered by Hindus, Buddhists, Jains, and Bon followers. Known for its symmetrical, diamond-like shape, it is the source of major Asian rivers

Mansarovar

Located at 4,556m, Lake Mansarovar is a sacred destination. Hindus believe it originated in Lord Brahma's mind, while Buddhists consider it the conception site of Lord Buddha



Holy Sites Of Yatra

Chiu Gompa Hot Spring & Monastery

'Chiu' means Sparrow, referencing Guru Rinpoche's guided arrival. The monastery features a cave temple with 8th-century footprints



Yam Dwar

Yam Dwar (Gateway of the God of Death) stands at 4,724m. As the starting point of Mt. Kailash's parikrama, Hindus believe Yam God guards Lord Shiva's abode. Completing the parikram here is said to guarantee a place in heaven.



Nandi parvat

A revered peak dedicated to Nandi, Lord Shiva's loyal devotee and sacred vehicle, a bull. As gatekeeper and guardian of Mt. Kailash, Nandi Parvat holds immense spiritual significance.



Ashtapad

Ashtapad, meaning 'eight steps', is a pilgrimage site features numerous caves and is believed to have eight mountain peaks.



Holy Sites Of Yatra

Charan Sparsh of Mt. Kailash



Charan Sparsh, or 'Touching Feet', is a sacred ritual in this parikrama, where devotees trek to touch the base of Mt. Kailash, revered as Lord Shiva himself

Kailash Parikrama

The act of circumambulating around Mt. Kailash, a holy mountain. This path is around 52 km long trek with maximum altitude of 5585 m at Droma La Pass



Shivasthal



Shivasthal is a revered by Tibetans and marked by abundant prayer flags and ornaments. Symbolising life and death, Shivasthal is believed to reward donations in the next life.

Gauri Kund

Gauri Kund, also known as Parvati Sarovar, is a sacred lake, steeped in legend and mythology. Situated at 5,608 m, this 'lake of compassion' is described in the Shiva Purana.



Holy Sites Of Yatra

Tirthapuri



A sacred site associated with Guru Rimpoche (Padmasambhava), is home to the Vajravarahi Cave. The Tirthapuri Monastery, originally a Nyingma school of Tibetan Buddhism, houses the cave

Tarboche flagpole

Tarboche, a sacred flagpole on Mount Kailash, is a key site for the Saga Dawa festival.



Budhanilkantha Temple



The largest stone statue of Lord Vishnu in Nepal reclining on a bed of snakes in the middle of a pond. The 5 m. long granite image carved out of a single rock dates back to the Lichchhavi period.

Dirapuk & Zutulpuk Monastery

Dirapuk at north side & Zutul Puk monastery is located on the East side of Mount Kailash. In Tibetan, “Zutul” means miracle and “Puk” means cave. Both monastery was built in the 13th century.
